Fire

Calls

From 1/15 to 1/21, Jenks Fire Rescue responded to 26 incidents. Of these incidents, 16 were EMS calls 5 were false alarms and 5 were other emergencies.

- 1/15-Medical Emergency-Jenks Elementary-Jenks Fire Rescue was dispatched to the report of a female student in the nurse's office that was actively seizing. Crews assisted EMSA with patient care and transport.
- 1/16-Grass Fire-Los Cabos-Jenks Fire Rescue responded to the report of a small grass fire near Los Cabos. Crews extinguished the fire and determined that it was caused by a transformer that had blown. The scene was secured until PSO arrived.
- 1/17-Motor Vehicle Accident with Injuries/Rollover-Main Street-Jenks Fire Rescue was dispatched to the report of a rollover motor vehicle accident with injuries on Main Street. Crews assisted EMSA with patient care and transport and JPD with traffic control and cleanup.
- 1/18-Haz-Mat-Gas Leak-6th Ct-Jenks Fire Rescue responded to the report of the smell of gas in a residence. Crews checked the home with a four-gas monitor and found no hazards present. As part of the investigation it was noted that no CO detectors were installed. Crews advised the homeowner about the value of CO detectors.

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- 1/19-Motor Vehicle Accident with Injuries-111th and Elwood-Jenks Fire Rescue responded to the report of a two-vehicle accident with injuries at the intersection of 111th and Elwood. Crews assisted EMSA with patient care and transport and JPD with traffic control and cleanup.
